




Mount Ventoux

Domaine Des Anges

The vineyard of the angels so called because of it's situation at an altitude of 350m Domaine des Anges is a truly heavenly place both to stay and to make wine. The cool mountain breezes mean it doesn't suffer from the scorching heat often associated with the area.

Winemaker Ciaran Rooney, an Irishman who studied in South Africa and made his home in France, believes in low intervention winemaking. When the fruit is this good you don't need to play around with it. Recently Oz Clarke has included Ciaran's Cote de Ventoux Rouge 2007 and 2009 in his top 250 Wines for 2008 and 2010 while Jancis Robinson declares the wines to be some of the best value wines in the region.

DOMAINE ROCHE-AUDRAN

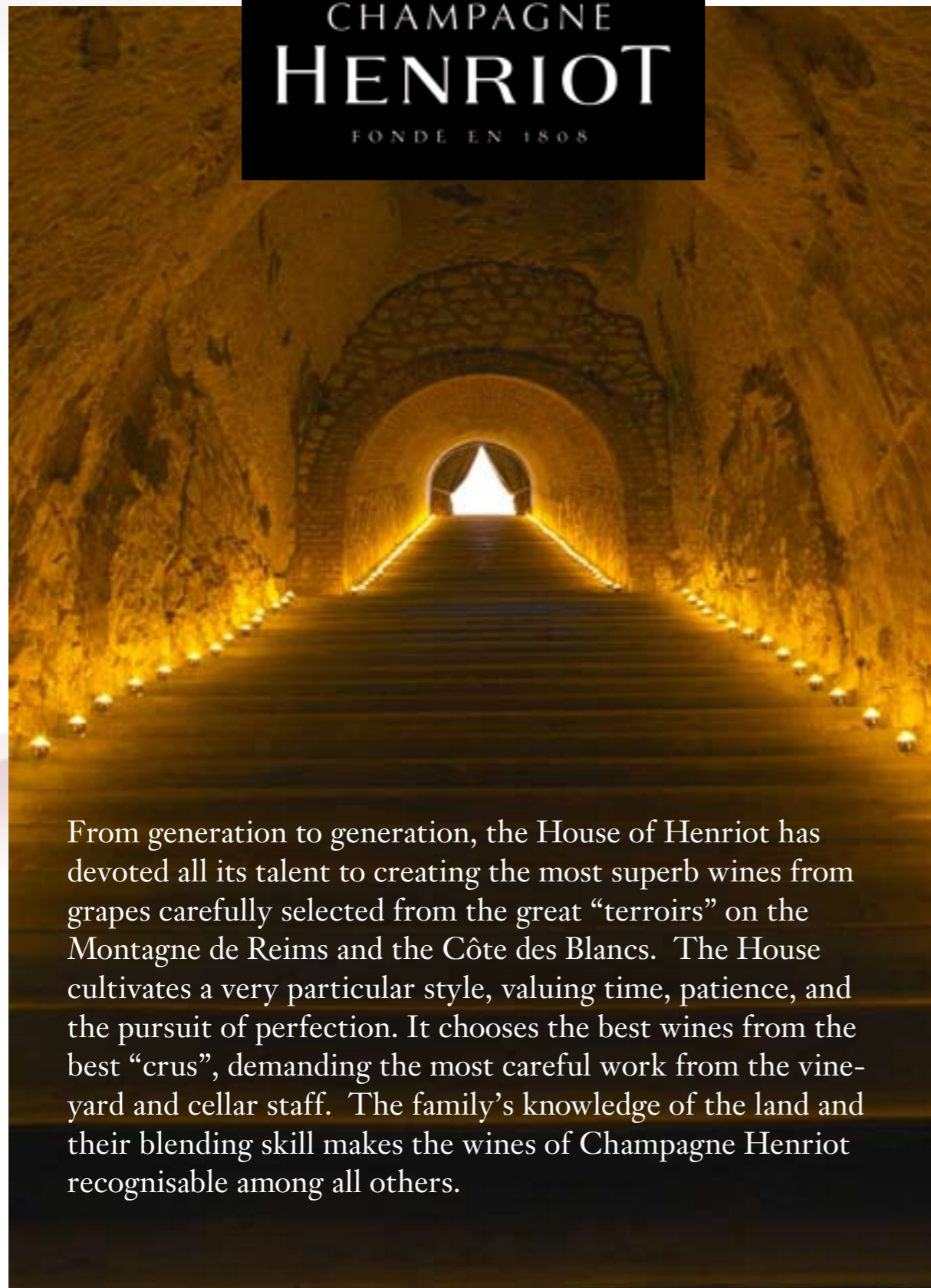
Situated on the Northern Slope of the Rasteau/Cairanne hills Domaine Roche Audran is an oasis of calm in one of the most famous vineyard areas in the world.

The domaine has been in the Rochette family for over 50 years but it was the current owner Vincent Rochette who saw the potential to make top quality wines rather than more everyday Cote du Rhone. By nurturing the existing old vines, some of which are nearly 100 years old, back to health using biodynamic techniques Vincent cleansed the soil of any residual pesticides. Such is Vincent's commitment to healthy soils delivering healthy vines that he even tends the vines of his neighbours to make sure than pesticides from their vines don't contaminate Domaine Roche Audran.

The grapes are harvested and sorted by hand with Vincent overseeing every part of the process, any grapes that don't make the grade are discarded as nothing short of perfection is good enough. The result is a collection of outstandingly good wines which are always in high demand and offer fantastic value for money.

We really wanted to order even more of these wines but they were already sold out. But we have been promised a further allocation for 2011.

Gyles was influenced in his wine-making by visits to Tuscany, Bordeaux and California.”
